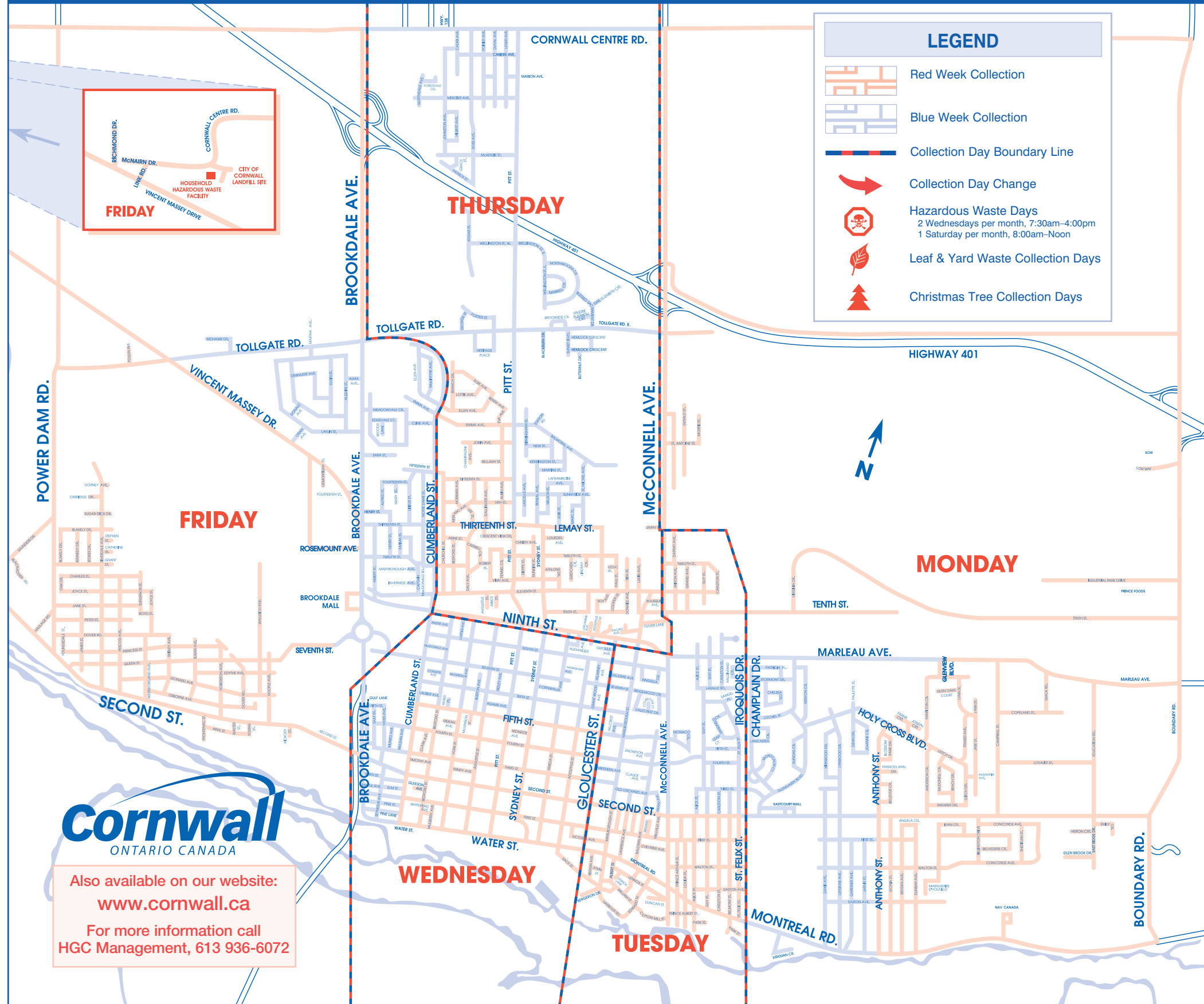

CHANGES TO THE GARBAGE AND RECYCLING PROGRAM IN APRIL 2012

The City of Cornwall is making some exciting changes to the garbage and recycling program beginning in April 2012.

Some of the highlights include:

- Implementation of weekly recycling collection
- Creation of a 'single-stream' recycling process
- Creation of a new bi-monthly bulky waste collection program
- Extension of the Leaf and Yard Waste program to 16 weeks per year

These measures are aimed at increasing recycling rates and diverting more material from the City Landfill Site, thereby extending its expected lifespan.

Cornwall's Bi-Weekly Blue & Black Box COLLECTION PROGRAM

Inside your Blue Box

CONTAINERS: PLACE LOOSE (NO BAGS)

GLASS BOTTLES AND JARS:

Please rinse containers. Recycle caps but remove from containers. No need to remove labels.



ALUMINUM AND STEEL CANS AND RIGID ALUMINUM FOIL CONTAINERS:

Please rinse and place lids inside cans and remove all food and grease from containers. No need to remove labels or flatten cans. Flatten foil and plates and fold together into one unit. Place loose in Blue Box.



METAL AEROSOL CANS:

Place empty cans in Blue Box.

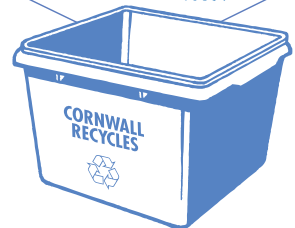
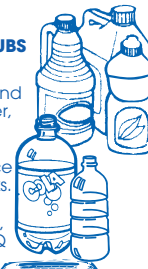
PAINT CANS AND LIDS:

Take top off empty metal paint cans and place both the top and can in Blue Box.



PLASTIC BOTTLES, TUBS AND CONTAINERS:

Plastic bottles, jugs and tubs from juice, water, household cleaning products, shampoo, yogurt, margarine, ice cream and soft drinks. Clear plastic cookie, fruit & veggie, muffin, egg carton, and BBQ chicken containers.



Inside your Black Box

PAPER PRODUCTS: PLACE IN BAGS OR BUNDLE

BOXBOARD:

Boxes from household products like cereal, detergent, shoes and crackers. Please remove residue and liners and flatten.



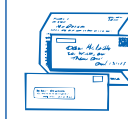
SOFT COVER BOOKS:

Pamphlets, folders and booklets. Place together with newspapers in a plastic or brown paper bag.



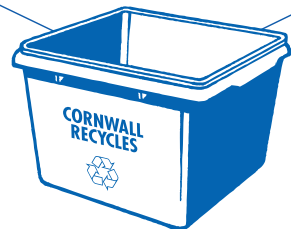
HOUSEHOLD PAPER:

Includes junk mail, envelopes, notepaper, computer paper and brown paper bags. Tuck into boxboard box and place in Black Box.



NEWSPAPERS, INSERTS, MAGAZINES, CATALOGUES, AND PHONE BOOKS:

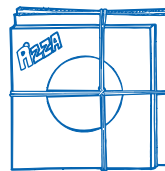
Place together in a plastic or brown paper bag. Place next to or on top of Black Box.



Beside your Black Box

CORRUGATED CARDBOARD:

Corrugated cardboard has tiny spaces in the middle section and this is commonly used for shipping stereos and large appliances. Flatten and bind in bundles not more than 36" x 36" x 12" thick. Keep corrugated cardboard and boxboard separate from newspapers.



Do not include

- Drinking boxes.
- Aluminum foil with food scraps or grease. No foil with paper or plastic lamination (no takeout food lids, no butter/candy/cigarette wrapping, no yogurt lids, no metalized chip bags, no blister foil). Do not stuff aluminum into other cans or containers.
- Books with hard cover bindings.
- Dishes, window glass, light bulbs or mirrors.
- Frozen juice cans (unless all metal), metal pots or other metal products.
- Foam cups or plates or film plastic.
- Full or partially full aerosol cans and paint cans should be used up, given away or disposed of safely at the City's Household Special Waste Depot.
- Sharps: needles, knives and saw blades.
- Milk/juice cartons and plastic bags.

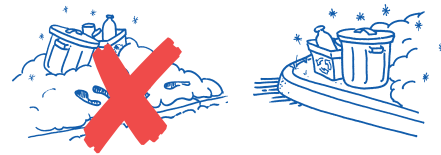

Solid Waste & Recycling Regulations

1. Homeowners are responsible for their garbage and Blue/Black Box until final collection.
2. Please do not place solid waste or Blue/Black Box materials on top of snow banks.
3. Clear snow to ground level at the end of your driveway or near the curb where solid waste and Blue/Black Box material is to be placed for final collection. Do not block the sidewalk.
4. During winter conditions, it is the responsibility of the homeowner to expose and loosen solid waste or Blue/Black Box material covered by snowfall and/or snow removal equipment.

Please do not place refuse on top of snowbanks.

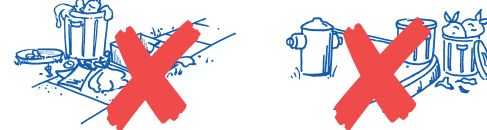


5. All uncollected material must be removed from the curbside that same day.

Putting waste out for collection

Place your properly prepared solid waste at the curb after 7:00 p.m. the night before or prior to 7:00 a.m. on the day of your regular solid waste and Blue/Black Box collection. Do not block walkways or place the refuse in the street. Containers must be commercially manufactured garbage containers.

Please do not block the sidewalk or place solid waste in the street.



Properly Prepared Material

- 136 litre (30 gal) containers, 27 kg (60 lbs) or less.
- Bags designed for use as garbage bags. Min. size: 60 cm x 90 cm (24 in x 36 in)



Improper Containers

- Pails, large drums and cardboard boxes are not acceptable.
- Cardboard that is placed in garbage bags or cans will result in the container not being collected.



Loose wood, trees, bushes, hedges, etc.

All stacks of branches or wood must be tied in tightly bound bundles. The bundles must never be more than 1 m (3 feet) in length or more than 1 m (3 feet) in diameter or weigh more than 27 kg (60 lbs).

Yard debris may be placed in a standard garbage bag not less than 762 mm (30 in) or more than 1,270 mm (50 in) or in a standard refuse container, but in no case can the weight exceed 27 kg (60 lbs). City residents are encouraged not to put yard debris out for garbage collection, but rather compost this material.



White Goods

White goods (scrap refrigerators, stoves, washers, dryers, freezers, dishwashers, hot water tanks, furnaces) will not be collected via the regular garbage collection contractor.

Homeowners should:

1. When negotiating the purchase of a new appliance, stipulate the disposal of the old appliance by the vendor.
2. Contact local reuse entrepreneurs or scrap metal dealers for collection/disposal of scrap white good items.
3. Deliver scrap white goods (including freon appliances) to the City Landfill Site. Tipping fee charges will be levied.
4. White good items may be collected by the City at a cost of \$25.00 per unit on a monthly basis. Collection permits must be purchased from the City Taxation Department. Doors must be removed from refrigerators and freezers.



Scrap Tires

Scrap tires will not be collected at the curb. Residents are encouraged to:

1. Recycle old tires at the point of purchase.
2. Deliver old tires to the City Landfill Site. Tipping fee charges will be levied.



Heavy Garbage Collection

The Garbage Contractor provides an "as encountered" heavy collection. Generally, this means that each resident will be allowed to put out their heavy refuse for collection on their regular collection day.

1. With the exception of brick, asphalt, stones or concrete, residents may place to the curbside for collection broken plaster, lumber, carpet or other wastes from construction or demolition. These items are to be placed in commercially manufactured garbage containers, 22 to 136 litres (5 to 30 gal) or stacked and tied in bundles not exceeding 1m (3 feet) in any dimension or 27 kg (60 lbs) in weight.

DO NOT contain any waste in cardboard boxes. Waste materials contained in cardboard boxes shall not be collected.

2. Discarded household furniture and furnishings will be accepted at the curb.

NOTE: Old batteries, all metals, electrical wiring, metal bathtubs and sinks are accepted at local scrap metal dealers.

3. Automobile parts will not be collected at the curb.

Fall Leaf and Yard Waste

The City will provide a special collection for leaf and yard waste in the Fall of 2011. Simply place leaf and yard waste at the curb on your regular solid waste collection day during the following five (5) week period:

October 17 through November 18, 2011

The City will also be holding a spring yard waste collection in the Spring for a (4) four week period. Please check your local newspapers and the city's website for the exact dates.

Outside of these dates, residents are encouraged to:

- Utilize mulching techniques to reduce volume of leaves.
- Utilize backyard composters
- Deliver leaf and yard waste (please no shrubs, large branches or brush) to the City's Compost Facility located at the City Landfill Site. Please de-bag all leaves contained in plastic bags.



REMINDER:

Leaf and yard waste must be contained in the following manner

- Approved compostable paper bags
- Clean returnable containers, i.e. garbage containers

In 2010 we composted 815 tonnes of leaf and yard waste!

Composting

Composting turns kitchen and yard waste into a dark, nutrient-rich material called compost. If you have a garden, a lawn, trees, shrubs, or even plant boxes, you can use compost to improve the soil and plant growth.

When compost is used on your lawn or garden it retains the moisture and nutrients necessary for plant growth.

Kitchen scraps such as fruit and vegetable peels and trimmings, egg shells and coffee grounds make excellent compost. You can also compost yard wastes such as the remains of garden plants, fallen leaves, grass clippings, and weeds before they seed.

Do not compost the following materials:

- Meat
- Chicken
- Fish
- Bones
- Milk
- Mayonnaise
- Salad Dressing
- Vegetable Oil
- Lard
- Peanut Butter

Composting these materials will increase odours and risk attracting scavenging animals and insects.

Household Hazardous Wastes

April to November

One (1) Saturday per month: 8:00am - 12Noon;
Two (2) Wednesdays per month: 7:30am - 4:00pm
(See calendar side for exact dates)



Paint: Latex and oil-based

Corrosive: Vehicle batteries, drain cleaners

Flammable: Lighter fluid, turpentine, gasoline, used oil

Toxic: Poisons, bleach, medications, pesticides,

paints, cleaning fluids, antifreeze, full aerosol cans

E-waste (Electronic Waste): Computers, keyboards, monitors, televisions (no wood console), fluorescent light bulbs, including the "curly" type.

In 2010 we collected 19 tonnes of E-waste!

What to do:

- For your protection, deliver toxics wrapped and labeled in the car trunk.
- Do not mix materials.
- Identify all toxics.
- Bring your hazardous waste to the Hazardous Waste Depot at the Landfill Site only on the designated days.

Important

- No PCBs, fireworks, flares, ammunition or paint produced prior to 1977 will be accepted.
- Unknown substances: call 613 936-6072.
- Do not place paint in the garbage.
- No needles.

Hazardous waste generated by industrial, commercial and institutional establishments shall not be accepted.

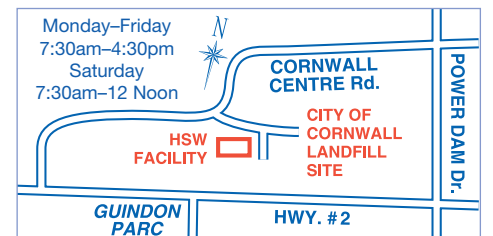
City of Cornwall Landfill Site

The City of Cornwall Landfill Site is located at 2590 Cornwall Centre Road West (613 933-6953). In addition to disposal services, the Landfill also encompasses diversion facilities including the Recycling Plant, tire recycling depot, scrap metal recycling pad, waste wood recycling pad, leaf and yard waste composting site and the Household Special Waste Depot.

Please Note:

- Haulers shall be responsible for advising the City upon entering the landfill site as to the origin of the waste(s) being hauled. Proof of residence may be requested.
- Should any hauler give false information when identifying the source of the load, that hauler shall be subject to penalty as stipulated in the solid waste by-law.
- Haulers must separate the following materials from regular solid waste upon arrival at the City landfill: old corrugated cardboard, scrap metal (including white goods), uncontaminated wood waste, scrap tires, leaf and yard waste.
- All open loads of waste are to be covered to avoid blowing litter while travelling to the Landfill Site.

NOTE: The Landfill Site is CLOSED on all statutory holidays and will close at 12 noon on December 24th and December 31st.
