




PUBLIC MEETING

The Planning Advisory and Hearing Committee will hold a Public meeting on **Monday, April 20, 2009 at 7:00 p.m.** in the Council Chambers at City Hall. The purpose of the meeting is to consider the following:

- An application for a Zoning Bylaw Amendment from Manufacturing 40 (MFR 40) to Manufacturing 40 (MFR 40) with a site specific exception to permit business or professional offices, on either a temporary or permanent basis, in the front part of the existing industrial building which presently houses a meat cutting school and a warehouse. The property is situated on the north side of Second Street East and east of Campbell Street, legally described as Part Lot West ½ of Lot B, Concession 1, and is municipally known as 3304 Second Street East. The subject site is depicted on the map on the right.
 
- A City initiated application for a Zoning Bylaw Amendment to further amend the City of Cornwall's Comprehensive Zoning Bylaw No. 751-1969. The application concerns the Planning Division's intention to attach a Hold to the Residential 20 (RES. 20) zoning on a property located behind Pitt Street and south of McKenzie Street. The purpose of the application will be to protect the residential development potential of these lands for a future plan of subdivision and also that development cannot take place until the Holding category is lifted through a subsequent public process. The Hold will also apply to the two City lots to prevent any access out to McKenzie Street, until a proper development scenario is presented. The subject site is depicted on the map on the right.
