YORK AND PAUL STREET CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

York and Paul street are scheduled for reconstruction. The project will include the reconstruction of the roadway with curb, gutter, sidewalk, new sanitary & storm sewer main and new watermain with new sewer and water laterals from mains to the property line as well as granular asphalt pavement structure.

Construction is scheduled for:

York Street from May 17th until approx. July 2nd, 2010
Paul Street from June 21st until approx. August 20th, 2010

For the York Street road closure, southbound traffic will be detoured via Fourth St., Pitt St. and Second St. while northbound traffic will be detoured via Second St., Cumberland St. and Fourth St. Third St. and Fourth St. are to remain open during the construction project.

PASSING OF ZONING BY-LAW

Take notice that the Council of the Corporation of the City of Cornwall passed By-law 065-2010 on Tuesday May 25, 2010, under Chap. P13, s.34 (18)(19) of the Planning Act, R.S.O. 1990 as amended; and

Take notice that any person or agency may appeal to the Ontario Municipal Board in respect of the By-law by filing, with the Clerk of the Corporation of the City of Cornwall no later than Thursday, June 17, 2010, a Notice of appeal setting out the objections to the By-law and the reasons in support of the objection.

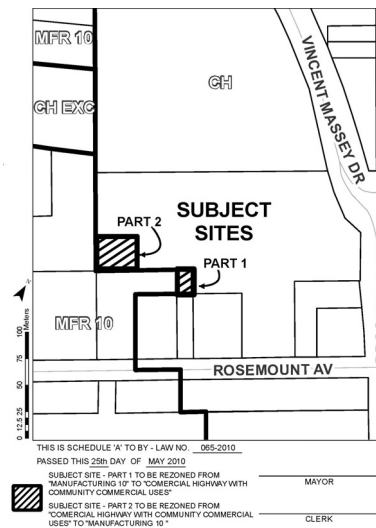
An explanation of the purpose and effect of the By-law describing those lands is attached. The complete By-law is available for inspection in the Clerk's Office during regular office hours.

Explanation of Purpose and Effect of By-law 065-2010
That the two subject parcels be rezoned as follows: Part 1 be rezoned to a Highway Commercial (C.H.) zone, with Community Commercial (C.C.) uses, and Part 2 be rezoned to Manufacturing 10 (MFR 10) zone, to accommodate a land swap.

The purpose and effect of this By-law is to allow for the land swap to be completed, which was approved by the Committee of Adjustment through applications B-05-10 and B-06-10. The Harden Group requires the additional land to allow for the possible expansion of the next proposed building, while the additional land on Rosemount Avenue will simply be added to their holdings.

The site subject to this rezoning is identified on Schedule "A".
