Please ensure that the sidewalk on your property does not contain mounds of snow left by the snow blowers or plows, that vehicles in your driveway are not blocking the sidewalks, and that garbage cans, shovels and other items are not resting on the sidewalks, all of which can become a danger to those trying to maneuver the sidewalks. School children and people walking, using strollers or wheelchairs shouldn't be forced to make a detour and navigate along the dangerous roadsides.

Please consider all those who utilize the sidewalks and keep your sidewalks clean, clear and accessible.
