Municipal offices will be closed on Friday, April 19 and Monday, April 22.

Facilities

The Aquatic Centre will be closed on Friday, April 19 and Sunday, April 21. The Benson Centre will be open for regular programming throughout the weekend. The Cornwall Civic Complex will be open to walkers and joggers throughout the weekend, but offices will be closed. The Cornwall Public Library will be closed on April 19, 21, and 22. The library will be open on Saturday, April 20 from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Seeking applications for committee

Leaf and Yard Waste

Leaf and Yard Waste Collection is back in the City of Cornwall. Collection starts Monday, April 15. Simply set out your leaf and yard waste alongside your garbage and recycling on your regular collection day. Leaf and yard waste should be placed in paper bags or labelled reusable containers. Bags and containers must weigh less than 27 kilograms/60 pounds. The following items cannot be included with leaf and yard waste:

- Animal feces
- Dirt/soil
- Sod
- Flower pots and plastic trays
- Kitchen organic waste (food scraps)
- Root balls
- Tree trunks
- Stumps
- Plastic bags
- Glass
- Gravel/stones

Springtime leaf and yard collection runs from April 15 to May 25. Collection begins again in the fall from September 16 to November 22.

HHW Depot Open

Hazardous Waste Days allow homeowners to drop off their waste, free of charge, at the City of Cornwall's landfill at 2590 Cornwall Centre Road. Here's what you can drop off at the depot:

- Paint: Latex & oil-based
- Vehicle batteries, drain cleaners
- Flammable fluids
- Toxic: Poisons, bleach, pesticides, paints, cleaning fluids, antifreeze, full or partially full aerosol cans
- Electronic waste
- Light bulbs
- Other items: Oil filters, empty oil containers, reusable and single-use batteries (please keep separate), smoke detectors

Hours for the depot are 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on select Wednesdays and 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. on select Saturdays. The depot will be open:

What's new with Cornwall Transit? **We've standardized all bus passes and tickets.** As of May 1, all services can use the same tickets: regular bus routes, Handi-Transit, and the community bus route. Any previously purchased Handi-Transit tickets will not expire, and will also be accepted on all other transit services. **On Wednesday, May 1, prices are changing.**

Adult monthly pass: \$65
Adult 10-ride card: \$25
Senior monthly pass: \$46
Senior 10-ride card: \$23
Student monthly pass: \$53
Student 10-ride card: \$23
Children 5 and under: free
Community pass: \$46

A real-time app is coming soon! The "Way to Go" app will provide users with information about where the bus is thanks to a new program called AVL: Automatic Vehicle Locator. The bus tracker will be available on Cornwall Transit's website and as a smart phone app. Stay tuned! Want an immediate notification when the service becomes available? These changes are based on recommendations in the Transit Master Plan to reduce the number of fare mediums, be compliant with the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act, and to introduce a real-time tracking system that will enhance the riding experience for passengers.
