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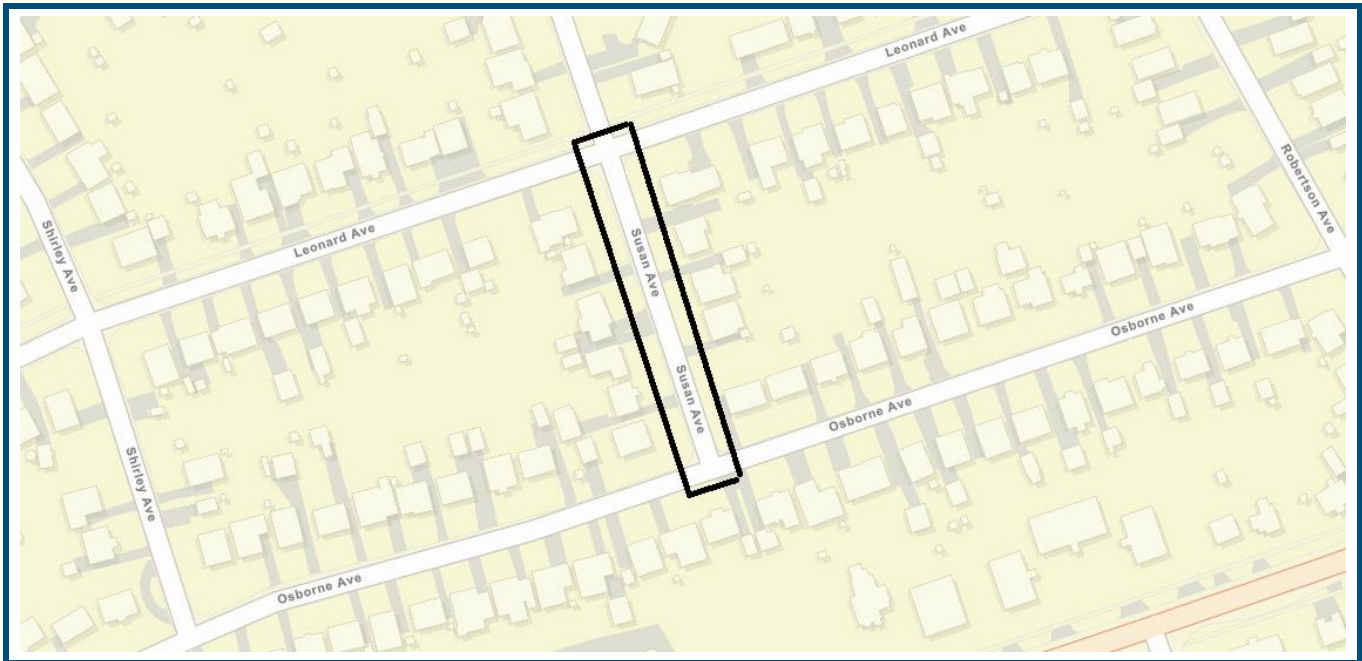
## CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

TENDER NO.	20-T05
WORK TO BE COMPLETED	Watermain Relining on Susan Av from Osborne Av to Leonard Av

Dear Homeowner/Tenant:

The City of Cornwall will be undertaking watermain relining in your area starting May 11, 2020. The work will take place on Susan Avenue from Osborne Avenue to Leonard Avenue. This project is part of the Council approved 2020 Watermain Rehabilitation Capital Budget.

### Work Details

- At the onset of construction, you should expect to see the Contractor bring equipment on-site and prepare work areas; you may also see paint marks on the roadway and flags in the boulevard which indicate the location of any buried infrastructure (gas mains, electrical, sewers, etc.).
- The Contractor will then install a temporary water supply system and attach the system to your residence/property. Residents should expect a short-duration disruption to the water supply when switching over to the temporary water system. Notices will be sent to all residences prior to the disruption.
- Work includes the excavation of pits in the road or boulevard to access the existing watermain.
- The Contractor will then clean and structurally reline the existing watermain.
- Once the watermain has been relined, properties will be reconnected to the newly relined watermain; residents will again experience a short-term disruption to the water supply but will be notified prior to the disruption.
- Lastly, the Contractor will remove the temporary water supply piping and restore all work areas with asphalt, concrete or grass.

**What to Expect During Construction**

- You may experience dust, noise and other inconveniences as a result of construction activities. The City and Contractor will make every effort to minimize impacts to residents as much as possible - we appreciate your patience during construction.
- Property owners are responsible for the removal of items located within City property limits (boulevard) – such as landscaping and or decorative objects before work begins. If you have sprinklers systems within the boulevard, please contact the City's Project Supervisor. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items on City property.

	<b>Work Hours:</b> Work will take place from 7:00am to 6:00pm, Monday to Friday, with after-hours and weekend work only as required or in an emergency.
	<b>Road &amp; Sidewalk Access:</b> In order to complete work in a safe manner, there will be road and sidewalk restrictions within the work zone; access for emergency vehicles will be maintained. <b>Driveway Access:</b> The Contractor will notify you of any temporary restrictions to driveway access; if your property has two entrances, one entrance will be kept open at all times.
	<b>Water Service Disruptions:</b> From time-to-time, the water supply to your property will be shut-off to complete construction; the contractor will provide at least 24-hour advance notice. In the event you did not received advanced notice, an emergency water shut off could have been necessary.
	<b>Accessible Accommodation:</b> Residents who require accommodation (level entry, longer notice, etc.) should contact the City's Project Supervisor to arrange for access during the construction period.
	<b>Traffic Management:</b> All efforts will be made to maintain the traffic flows; local residents and roadway users may experience delays and increased traffic on nearby streets
	<b>Parking:</b> Parking in the active work zone is not permitted due to space requirements for construction equipment and materials.
	<b>Garbage &amp; Recycling:</b> Please follow your normal routine. If required, the Contractor will move bins to an appropriate location and return them. Please ensure that you label your bins with your address.
	<b>Restoration:</b> The construction work area will be restored with sod and/or asphalt where required. Interlocking bricks, flagstone on a granular base, or other similar features that are removed from public and private property during construction will be reinstated. Lawn seeding and/or laying of sod will be completed during the ideal growing seasons only - spring (April to June) and fall (September to October).

**For any inquiries or for assistance throughout construction, please contact the City's Project Supervisor who is responsible for the oversight of all field operations during construction.**
