

CITY COUNCIL #10-79

April 9, 1979.

The Regular Meeting of City Council was held this evening when the following members were present - His Worship Mayor G. Parisien, Aldermen D. Armstrong, R. Aubry, G. Cameron, F. Guindon, L. Keen, A. Lebano, A. LeBlanc, R. Lalonde, B. Lynch, J. Pescod, G. Samson and G. Williamson.

Adoption of Minutes

Moved by Aldermen Williamson and Pescod that the minutes of the March 26th meeting of Council be adopted. Carried.

Moved by Aldermen Keen and Lynch that the minutes of the Committee of Council meeting of March 26th be adopted. Carried.

Moved by Aldermen Lalonde and Samson that the minutes of the Committee of Council meeting of March 29th be adopted. Carried.

Moved by Aldermen LeBlanc and Lebano that the minutes of the Committee of Council meeting of April 4th be adopted. Carried.

Committee of the Whole

Moved by Aldermen Williamson and Armstrong that Council go into Committee of the Whole and that all delegations, resolutions, communications and by-laws be referred to that committee and that By-laws 036 to 039 be given first reading -

- By-law 036 - To amend By-law 48/66
 037 - To authorize signing Agreement with John Lascelle
 038 - To authorize signing Grant of Easement with Lionel Caron
 039 - To give numbers to houses located on Queen St.

DELEGATIONS

Family Counselling Centre - Mr. C. MacHaffie, reading from a prepared statement, expressed concern for the future of the Family Counselling Centre of Cornwall and the United Counties. He requested that Council consider an increase in the hourly rate under the purchase of services agreement for 1979 as well as minimum funding equal to 1976 level.

Moved by Aldermen Lebano and Pescod that the request be referred to Current Budget deliberations. Carried.

COMMUNICATIONS

1. Boulevard Paving, Permit System - Moved by Aldermen Pescod and Cameron that By-law No. 1979, 1976 be amended as recommended by the Director of Public Works and that Administration be directed to carry out the administration of the Boulevard Paving Permit System. Carried.
2. Environmental Control Committee - Moved by Aldermen Guindon and Lalonde that the minutes of the March 13th meeting be received. Carried.
3. Pavement on Reneal - Moved by Aldermen Keen and Lynch that a petition from Richard Martell and others for pavement on Reneal from Sunnyside to Martine be referred to the Director of Engineering Services. Carried.
4. Tender #10-79 - Moved by Aldermen Williamson and Cameron that the recommendations of the Fire Chief and the Purchasing Agent for the purchase of Fire Department Clothing Uniform be approved in the total amount of \$2,577.36. Carried.
5. Local Architectural Conservation Advisory Committee Moved by Aldermen Lynch and Williamson that the minutes of March 28th be received. Carried.
6. Planning Board - Moved by Aldermen Pescod and Lebano that the minutes of March 28th be adopted. Carried.
7. Joint Steering Committee, Energy Conservation - Moved by Aldermen Samson and Keen that a letter dated March 23rd from the Ministry of Energy and the Association of Counties and Regions of Ontario be filed. Carried.
8. Cornwall Rugby Club - Moved by Aldermen Williamson and Guindon that a request for financial assistance in the amount of \$1,500 be referred to current budget deliberations. Carried.
9. Tender #12-79 - Moved by Aldermen Lynch and LeBlanc that the bid of Simon J. Villeneuve for Grass Cutting be accepted at a price of \$7.89 per hour or a total of \$2,998.20. Carried.
10. Capitol Theatre Parking Lot - Moved by Aldermen Pescod and Aubry that required property be acquired to provide for an additional 36 parking spaces over and above the 73 that can be accommodated on the present theatre site at an estimated value of \$39,600.00.

An amendment was moved by Aldermen Keen and Williamson that the matter be referred to current budget deliberations. Amendment carried and motion defeated.

11. Sewage Disposal Plant - Moved by Aldermen Pescod and Guindon that:
 WHEREAS the City of Cornwall and the Ministry of the Environment have been carrying on discussions with respect to the transferring of operating responsibility of the pollution control plant servicing Cornwall;
 AND WHEREAS the City desires to carry out a study to investigate and improve, if possible, the plant sampling and data collection and to receive a report on present plant performance and operation;
 THEREFORE the Corporation of the City of Cornwall requests the Ministry of the Environment to release sufficient funds from the Reserve for Working Funds to cover the cost of this study to an upset limit of \$7,500.00. Carried.
12. Garden Bros. Circus - Moved by Aldermen Keen and Pescod that a request to waive a daily fee of \$200 be refused and that the City re-examine its position with respect to sites wherein circuses and the like could be located in future as well as carrying out a complete review of its fee structures for this type of amusement. Carried.
13. Family Court Support Worker - Moved by Aldermen Lynch and Williamson that a request for the addition of one employee to the Social Services Department for Family Court purposes be referred to current budget deliberations. Carried.

COUNCIL


The Chairman of the Committee of the Whole reported to Council the actions of the Committee including the second reading of the by-laws and recommendations for enactment.


Committee of the Whole - Moved by Aldermen Pescod and Samson that the Committee of the Whole be adopted. Carried.
