#1 **Ontario Heritage Foundation Award** - Mr. Michael Logan

Mr. Achim Jankowski LACAC representative, presented to Mike Logan a framed Certificate of Achievement and pin from the Heritage Community Recognition Program. This award is in its 5th year and recognized properties that have maintained his historical formation. Mr. Logan's property is the former Cline House which received its historical designation in 1979.

#2 Transit Comprehensive Review - Entra Consultants Inc.

Councillor André Rivette introduced Angela Iannuzziello, Principal Dennis Fletcher, Senior Project Manager from ENTRA Consultants Inc. who provided Council with an overview of the Comprehensive Transit Review. Ms. Iannuzziello indicated that the mandate was to review every aspect of Cornwall's transit operations. Seven important conclusions were developed and these guided the development of the recommendations contained in this review. The Review further introduced Peer Group Comparisons for Productive Measures and Major Expense Categories. Cornwall Transit is situated in the middle of the peer group identified.

A lengthy listing of recommendations were read out from the Review and each consultant provided answers to Councillors questions.

3. Traffic Speed - Riverdale & Charles



WHEREAS citizens in the area are looking at alternative options to help regulate the traffic and speed at the above mentioned corner;


