005-2002 Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario

WHEREAS the Minister of Health and Long Term Care has indicated the Provincial Government's acceptance of the findings of a report called "Specialized Pediatric Services Review: Report of the Minister's Advisory Committee," outlining the future of specialized pediatric services in Ontario; and

WHEREAS this report recommends the establishment of a single centre of excellence for pediatric cardiac surgery in the Province and for the consolidation of all pediatric tertiary cardiac surgery in Ontario at the Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto; and

WHEREAS this surgery is currently performed at the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario in Ottawa and at the Children's Hospital of Western Ontario in London; and

WHEREAS the consolidation of these services in Toronto will cause additional financial hardships and emotional distress on residents of Eastern Ontario, who can now more easily travel to access the excellent services of the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario in Ottawa and be with their sick children in their time of greatest need;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the City of Cornwall hereby request the Minister of Health and Long-Term Care and the Government of the Province of Ontario to reconsider the acceptance of the recommendations of the "Specialized Pediatric Review Committee" in particular the recommendations to consolidate all tertiary cardiac surgery at the Toronto Hospital for Sick Children; and

FURTHERMORE that the Minister of Health and Long-Term Care direct that these services continue to be provided at their present locations which provide this service in a balanced way throughout the Province and in a manner closer to the people who are being served by these programs.

WHEREAS, Cornwall City Council is always desirous of attracting tourists to the municipality, all while improving our City's image; and

WHEREAS, the Corporation of the City of Cornwall is continuously looking at new, creative, ingenious ideas to improve our waterfront in its present state; and

WHEREAS, many of our citizens as well as tourists take advantage of our waterfront in its present state; and

WHEREAS, development of the waterfront can be a successful endeavor to attract new tourists to our municipality; and

WHEREAS, the plans to build the "All Canadian Seaway" have been abandoned earlier this year by the Federal Government;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Cornwall City Council authorize Administration to prepare a report on the feasibility of the following:

1. The creation of a "Boardwalk" development off the Saint Lawrence shore line, that will span the length of the most eastern part of land behind the Legion Ball Park to the end of Cornwall's Eco Gardens behind the R.C.A.F.A. Wing.
2. The feasibility and impact of allowing the creation of food stands and small rentals shops at strategic places along the Boardwalk.
3. The possibility of applying for Provincial and Federal funding for this initiative; and
4. The approval to develop this site and begin this initiative be subject to any restrictions in the lease between the Corporation of the City of Cornwall and the Saint Lawrence Seaway.
5. That the Waterfront Committee be invited to comment and provide input on this waterfront development.

WHEREAS, the cost of education is becoming more and more expensive, especially for those who decide to study outside of their community, and for those who live on their own or in residence; and

WHEREAS, many of Cornwall's youth are leaving this community to further their post-secondary education in other cities as Cornwall does not offer all levels of post-secondary education that they require or that the cost of their post-secondary education is too expensive; and

WHEREAS, post-secondary education is almost a prerequisite for most employees trying to find employment; and

WHEREAS, Cornwall City Council is always interested in providing our youth with the best, most affordable option in order to encourage them to proceed with their post-secondary education; and

WHEREAS, post-secondary institutions not only provide individuals, young and old alike, with an opportunity to further themselves academically, but also offers a community an opportunity of reaping the economic benefits, and to potentially increase their population; and

WHEREAS, Cornwall presently does provide various forms of post-secondary institutions, however it does not offer a university; and

WHEREAS, Cornwall's cost of everyday living is lower in this municipality than compared to others, and we should take advantage of that factor; and

WHEREAS, universities are strictly a Provincial government issue, with the Federal government assisting on occasion with funding towards education;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Administration prepare a report back to Council on the feasibility of establishing a university in the City of Cornwall or partnering with educational institutions currently in Cornwall.

NEW BUSINESS

1. OHL Franchise

Moved by Councillors Denis Carr and Andre Rivette that:

WHEREAS for the past 5 years the City of Cornwall has been looking for a major tenant for the Cornwall Civic Complex; and on three separate occasions a group represented by Mr. Ken Cook of Guelph Ontario has been unsuccessful in their efforts to purchase and move an existing Ontario Hockey League (OHL) franchise to the City of Cornwall; and

WHEREAS the OHL has stated on several occasions that any future league expansion would be exclusively to the United States and why therefore would the OHL be opposed to the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League (QMJHL), (who would welcome Cornwall) moving an existing franchise from Montreal to Cornwall.

Now Therefore Be it resolved that the City of Cornwall relay to the Board of Governors of the OHL our disappointment in their recent actions that prevent Cornwall joining the Quebec League where we consider their actions to be unfair and restrictive and take strong exception to the OHL position; and


