2016-03 Sustainable Funding Support for Koala Place and Child and Youth Advocacy Centres in Ontario

Whereas Child and Youth advocacy Centres (CYAC's) provide a coordinated approach to addressing the needs of child and youth victims and/or witnesses in the criminal justice system. CYAC's seek to minimize system-induced trauma by providing a single, child-friendly setting for youth victims or witnesses and their families to seek services; and

Whereas CYAC's currently receive financial support through local fundraising and limited federal funding; and

Whereas provincial governments across Canada, including the Province of Ontario do not provide sustainable dollars to support CYAC's, resulting in a wide variance as to what resources are available for children and youth; and

Whereas Ontario Ministries sustain programs and funding for child welfare, health, police and public safety, but not CYAC's which provide all of these services; and

Whereas the Ontario Provincial Government is focused on addressing issues of poverty, homelessness and sexual assault which can be potential outcomes of untreated child abuse and trauma and on creating new community hubs; and

Whereas Alberta is the only province in Canada which currently provides sustainable funding for CYAC's including the Sheldon Kennedy Centre. Through the Children First Act, the Province of Alberta reallocated dollars from various ministries including child welfare, social services, policing and health services to provide core services to child victims through CYAC's without requiring new funding; and

Whereas CYAC's have been in existence for almost thirty years in the United States and Koala Place is the fourth to open in Ontario; and

Whereas the creation of Koala Place (previously known as "PrévAction") is a direct response from the numerous recommendations which came out of the Cornwall Public Inquiry (established by the Government of Ontario on April 14, 2005, under the *Public Inquiries Act*). As stated in Volume 2, Report of the Cornwall Inquiry Phase 2 Services and Programs for Healing & Reconciliation: "The Ministry of the Attorney General should provide funding of up to \$2.8 million for the establishment and operation of a Family and Child Advocacy Centre in Cornwall, based on the proposal of PrévAction, and supported by the Children's Aid Society of the United Counties of Stormont, Dundas & Glengarry and the Cornwall Community Police Service. Staffing and operational funding should be provided for a period of at least five years."; and

Whereas, recommendation #19 that came out of the inquest into the tragic death of five year old Jeffrey Baldwin states "That the Ministry of Children and Youth Services and Ministry of Community Safety and Correctional Services, in consultation with the Ontario Association of Children's Aid Society and provincial police authorities, shall expand the Child and Youth Advocacy Centre model across Ontario and provide the funding necessary to sustain the province-wide expansion."

Now therefore be it resolved that the Council of The Corporation of the City of Cornwall urges the Government of Ontario to direct the Ministry of the Attorney General, Ministry of Children and Youth Services, Ministry of Health and Ministry of Corrections and Public Safety to work together to create a sustainable core funding formula for Koala Place and Ontario's Child and Youth Advocacy Centres; and

Now therefore be it further resolved that Administration be directed to circulate this Resolution to the Ministry of the Attorney General, the Ministry of Children and Youth Services, the Ministry of Health, the Ministry of Corrections and Public Safety; and

Now therefore be it further resolved that Administration be directed to provide this Resolution to MPP Jim McDonnell, MPP Grant Crack, MP Guy Lauzon, the municipalities of Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry, Mohawk Council of Akwesasne and the Association of the Municipalities of Ontario and request their support.


